



KMC Student Wi-Fi 2021 – 2022

You can connect your own laptop, tablet or smart phone to the KMC BYOD Wi-Fi as follows

1. Browse for Wireless networks on your device
2. Choose KMC BYOD from the list
3. If the login box does not appear, open a web browser and try to access web page; this should bring you a login box
4. Now login with your usual KMC network login details

Your device should now be connected to the KMC BYOD Wi-Fi.
