Our Courses We adopt an individual approach in the teaching of each student whilst creating a safe and nurturing environment for them to thrive in. The experienced and friendly team is dedicated to teaching students essential social and practical skills in a wide range of subjects, helping students to progress into further study and employment. We offer the followings levels: Preparation for Level 1 Introduction to Skills for Working Life - Entry 2 Certificate in Skills for Working Life - Entry 3 Practical Skills Development - Entry Level Certificate in Employability and Personal Development Level 1 routes into our Further Education courses include: Agriculture | Animal Welfare & Science | Construction | Equine Studies | Horticulture & Plant Science | Outdoor Adventure | Welding, Fabrication & Blacksmithing | Wildlife, Ecology & Conservation

Preparation for Level 1 This course is designed to help students develop the skills they will need to progress onto a Level 1 land-based course the following year. They will gain confidence and learn to work independently, research information, summarise and present their findings in a variety of formats. This will allow students to develop their spoken and written communication, improve their IT skills and help them to build confidence in their ability to meet Level 1 assessment requirements. An additional element of this course is Skills for Independence and Work which involves working on a range of essential life and employability skills. Additionally, students will be able to engage in a range of practical land-based activities, including horticulture, tractor driving and taking care of livestock. These practical sessions will allow students to develop their team-work and will equip them with the basic practical knowledge required for a range of Level 1 courses. The underpinning theory of land-based studies will also be covered, including basic animal biology and nutrition, plant biology and ecology. Their study programme will also include English and maths lessons. Apply at kmc.ac.uk





Practical Skills Development - Entry Level This course builds on the knowledge students have learnt from other Skills for Working Life courses and focuses on allowing students to gain more work experience. Peakhill Produce


