All students are required to do an element of work experience as part of their study programme. Work placements allow students to develop practical and professional skills that will be used in the workplace and beyond. Work placements are monitored and regulated by academic staff. Curriculum-led labour-market information (LMI) is accessed in lessons, through industry-specific core units, there is also a wealth of LMI available on the internal KMC Careers Team which all students have access to following enrolment.

The College has excellent links with employers and we are always looking for new ways to collaborate with them to help benefit our students. Employer engagement activities include:

- Guest speakers, in-person and online
- Visits to the workplace
- Contributing to Careers Week, a major national event in March every year
- Hosting work placement students
- Connecting with academic teams to review our curriculum, and ensure that the courses we offer meet local needs and are fit for purpose
- Industry led mock interviews
- Exhibiting at our annual careers fair

The Careers Team provide expert impartial advice and guidance to help students prepare for the workplace. This can be on a 121 basis or in group workshops. Our Careers Advisor is qualified at Level 6 and has extensive experience supporting students and tailoring guidance to meet individual needs. The Careers Team are committed to CPD (Continual Professional Development) to provide learners with relevant and up-to-date advice and guidance.
