#### November 11th 2022

Kingston Maurward College Parade of Remembrance, November 11th 2022. Today we held our annual Remembrance Day Parade. The whole College participated, including some of the animals on-site, to represent the ongoing support that horses and dogs play in many serving roles today. Horses from our equine department led the parade, crowned in wreaths made by the Floral Design department. They served as a symbol of the many horses lost in both world wars. The dogs in the parade included an ex-military service dog previously stationed in Afghanistan. Students from our Combined Cadet Force and Military Preparation courses marched at the head of the column, followed by students from all other academic fields.

Ex-service personnel staff laid wreaths, whilst one of our Teaching Assistants played the Last Post and Reveille on the Cornet. Our Level 2 Blacksmithing students made a steel wreath and memorial poppies, which were laid during the service. The poppies will be sold in aid of the Royal British Legion Poppy Appeal.

Luke Rake, Principal and CEO said; "As a civic institution, it is important to take time to remember the sacrifices of those taken for our liberty. As a community that also trains young people to work in the armed forces, we are proud to take this moment of reflection." The Kingston Maurward estate has direct links back to World War II when the Main House was taken over by the armed forces for the duration of the war. The Royal Army Medical Corps and the US Army were stationed on-site, and the park was used as a petrol storage depot for the D-day invasion. Today, all staff and students stood united in a common cause and spirit; to honour the courage and sacrifice of those who have served their country.

Today we remember the millions who perished during the Holocaust. The 'Legend Pole Two' was unveiled here last year at Kingston Maurward - a tribute to the rich culture and heritage of the Dorset Gypsy & Traveller communities.


#### **April 25th 2023**


