


# Kingston Maurward College

## November 10<sup>th</sup> 2023

A sunny November day provided the perfect opportunity to complete a site survey of the Kingston Maurward Cottage Garden. A group of Level 3 Horticulture students used the techniques of offsets, triangulation, and running total measurements to survey the garden.



#### November 13<sup>th</sup> 2023



Our annual Remembrance Day Parade saw several hundred students and staff led on foot by horses from the entrance of the estate to the front of the Main House. Principal, Luke Rake, addressed the congregation with a reading and poem. The Kingston Maurward estate has direct links back to World War II when the Estate was taken over by the armed forces for the duration of the war.



#### November 14<sup>th</sup> 2023



Our Year 2, Level 3 Sport and Fitness students visited Everyone Active in Blandford to get information about their exercise referral process. The students were completing Unit 29 - Exercise for Specific Groups, and were required to create an exercise referral programme.

They were put through two types of referral programmes, one for a client with mental health issues, and one for older adults (less impact).

#### November 17<sup>th</sup> 2023



The Walled Garden provided a sunny setting for our Level 2 Landscape Horticulture students to exercise their planting skills. The students spent time working to carefully plant different species of *Narcissus* which will provide a splash of botanical colour in the spring.

#### November 21<sup>st</sup> 2023

Eight crested geckos were hatched in 2023 in the Animal Welfare & Science department. Baby chinchillas were born over the summer and have been a real hit with students!

Lots of new animals have been arriving since the start of the September term: rabbits, guinea pigs, a cave gecko and Vietnamese mossy frogs! Students have helped with the initial health checks of the animals before they officially went into the collection after their quarantine period.







#### November 23<sup>rd</sup> 2023

Our Level 3 Extended Diploma Agriculture students went off-site for a visit to a local arable farm.

They undertook a tour, discussed the problematic Cabbage Stem Flea Beetle in Oilseed Rape crops, farming practices, and looked at machinery.

Special thanks to Emma and Chris Foot for hosting the students - it is always great for students to gain industry contextualisation by visiting different businesses.





#### November 28<sup>th</sup> 2023

Looking back at some of our trips from late last year, our degree students in HND Animal Management and FdSc Marine Ecology & Conservation went to Studland and Chesil Beach to measure profiles, practise techniques for recording beach shapes, and learn more about the change in plants in sand dune succession. Plus, it was a great a way to get to know each other and develop some teamwork skills!





## November 30<sup>th</sup> 2023

Hedge-laying lessons teach our students a traditional method of maintaining boundaries whilst increasing bio-diversity within hedgerows.

The demonstration showed students the future of maintenance machinery and the advances technology is making. Horticulture students joined them for this session and were privileged to be able to take a turn in operating the robot too.





#### December 1<sup>st</sup> 2023

Our Events Team requested festive floral displays in November, ready for Christmas parties and main house decor - Our Level 2 and Level 3 Floral Design students did not disappoint!

With traditional colours and a modern twist, they utilised faux flowers, foliage grown on campus, gold accents and fairy lights to create spectacular displays in the state rooms of our beautiful Georgian manor house.



#### December 5<sup>th</sup> 2023

Our HND Animal Management and FdSc Marine Ecology students joined together for an offsite visit to Osmington Mills to survey marine molluscs.

Students measured the diameter of Topshells, and by doing so, they hoped to monitor the population to see if they are breeding at Osmington - an indicator of climate change. Breeding regularly at this location could signify warmer conditions that allow survival here in the UK.

They also took the opportunity to measure limpets to test if they were showing signs of adaptations to avoid being eaten by crabs.







#### December 12<sup>th</sup> 2023

The College Combined Cadet Force (CCF) had their formal pass-off parade. The cadets were inspected and questioned on their military knowledge by members of the Royal Wessex Yeomanry - the College's affiliated regiment.

This marked the end of their initial training phase and meant the regiment accepted that the cadets were sufficiently trained and educated to wear the regimental cap badge on their berets. The cadets performed their parade with a skill belying their short time in uniform, and the inspectors remarked on how well they conducted themselves.

The cadets, who are on our Level 2 and Level 3 Military Preparation courses, will now go on to more in-depth training and learn more about their chosen military careers.

#### December 14<sup>th</sup> 2023



Our Animal Behaviour & Welfare students took great care in preparing our animals for the Christmas break. One important task is wing clipping our peafowl, chickens and waterfowl. This painless process helps keep our birds safe and prevents them flying too far from home. It's an essential skill for any students interested in bird management in the future.


