OUR COURSES

We adopt an individual approach in educating each student whilst creating a safe and nurturing environment for them to thrive in. There are no entry requirements, but you must love the outdoors and being active.

We offer the following levels:

- Introduction to Skills for Working Life Entry 2
- Award in Skills for Working Life Entry 3
- Preparation for Life Entry Level
- Work Based Pre-Internship
- Preparation for Level 1

After completing these courses, Foundation Learning students can consider Level 1 routes into the following areas:

Agriculture, Animal Welfare & Science, Construction, Equine Studies, Horticulture & Plant Science, Outdoor Adventure, and Wildlife, Ecology & Conservation.

AWARD IN SKILLS FOR WORKING LIFE - ENTRY 3

This course is ideal for those who want to develop their experience of land-based subjects and is suited to anyone who loves working with animals, driving tractors and being in the countryside. The programme provides in-house and external work experience situations, alongside working on the farm, taking part in lambing, looking after the calves, working in the gardens, or learning how to grow produce and cook it. Students will also further develop their life skills, activity levels, and employability skills.

PREPARATION FOR LIFE

This course builds on the knowledge students have learnt from other Skills for Working Life courses and focuses on allowing them to gain more experience, skills, knowledge, and to develop confidence. They will study a range of land-based subjects whilst developing their personal, social and employability skills.

WORK BASED PRE-INTERNSHIP

This course is open to all students with EHCPs and is a stepping stone towards a Supported Internship or employment.

On this course, you will spend one day a week learning about employability, English and maths, tutorial subjects and working towards completing your ECHP outcomes. As well as this, you will complete a weekly two-day placement in one of our commercial outlets to help you develop the essential skills needed for meaningful and sustained employment. Work experience placements include:

- The Barn Café and Canteen
- Kingston Maurward Gardens

PREPARATION FOR LEVEL 1

This course is designed to help students develop the skills they need to progress onto a Level 1 land-based course the following year. They will gain confidence and learn to work independently, work to develop their spoken and written communication, improve their IT skills, and help them prepare for their next steps.

An additional element of this course is the Skills for Independence and Work which involves developing a range of essential life and employability skills. Additionally, students will be able to engage in a range of practical land-based activities, including horticulture, tractor driving, and taking care of livestock.

The underpinning theory of land-based studies will also be covered, including basic animal biology and nutrition, plant biology and ecology. The study programme will also include English and maths lessons.




PEAKHILL PRODUCE

Learning Support at KMC - We're here to help!




FOOD 80RNK
